

Project Self-Sufficiency to Host Designer Showcase during the Month of June Historic Home Renovated by Local Designers

Project Self-Sufficiency has invited sixteen local interior designers to decorate separate areas of the historic Pettit home, an 1850's-era house which is located on the property currently being developed by the agency for its new campus at 127 Mill Street (Route 519) in Newton. The results of the designers' efforts will be on display during the month of June at the agency's first annual "Project ShowHouse." The public is invited to tour the historic home beginning Wednesday, June 4th, through the final day, Saturday, June 29th. The home will be open Wednesdays – Saturdays, from 11:00 – 4:00, and Sundays, 12:00 – 5:00. The venue will be closed Mondays and Tuesdays. Admission is \$25 per person. In addition to the tour, various seminars and presentations will be made throughout the month, on topics ranging from photography to floral arrangement to staging a home to prepare it for sale. Vendors will be on the campus selling home accessories, jewelry, gourmet foods and exquisite chocolates. The "ShowHouse Café," operated by renowned eatery Krave Café and Caterers, will offer lunch and snack items in an adjacent building. Work by several local artists will be displayed for sale in the café. Approximately 5,000 people are expected to tour the site. All proceeds will benefit Project Self-Sufficiency, a non-profit agency which specializes in services for low-income families.
